As part of our commitment to expanding our research capability, SALIS is pleased to offer 2 PhD scholarships for the academic year 2012/13:

• 2 full PhD scholarships of €12,000 plus fees (€4,900)

These scholarships are for one year, with the possible option of extension to a maximum of three years dependent on satisfactory progress by the student and the availability of funds. Some teaching or equivalent duties may be associated with the scholarships.

Interested candidates should include the following in their applications:

- CV
- Letter outlining the applicant's suitability for the scholarship
- Research proposal (no more than 3,000 words, including potential supervisor(s) and a bibliography)
- Names of two academic referees

Ideally candidates should have made initial contact with their potential supervisors and should also possess a relevant undergraduate degree (2.1 or first class honours) and/or hold a relevant masters qualification (honours). Having conducted some research in their chosen field would also be an advantage.
